Gap Analysis of Child Well-Being Indicators and Program Support

#### Children's Services Advisory Board (CSAB)

The attached Gap Analysis summarizes where Alachua County stands compared to the State of Florida in addressing 29 Child Well-Being Indicators. It also lists some programs currently providing services to Alachua County's children, prenatal to age 18, in the areas defined by the Indicators.

The Gap Analysis is intended to provide guidance to the Children's Trust of Alachua County Board as they determine their funding priorities: choosing to continue to support and/or scale up existing programs and collaborations or to create new programs and new collaborative systems of services.

The CSAB recommends to the Trust Board that it consider adopting some of the goals and guiding principles that informed the CSAB's activities over the last two years. In conceptualizing, obtaining the Board of County Commissioners' (BoCC) support and launching three new children's programs (NewboRN Home Visit, Transformative Professional Development and Social and Emotional Development and Family Support), the CSAB

- Chose specific, needs-based goals that would enhance the growth and development of young children.
- Developed programs that were innovative, identified and closed service gaps, but did not replicate existing programs.
- Recommended programs that would enhance the development of children throughout Alachua County, while targeting populations with special needs.
- Required that the grantees for these programs use evidence-based practices with measurable outcomes.
- Required that the grantees work with each other and with existing programs to create a collaborative, coordinated system of care for young children.

The CSAB recommends that the Children's Trust advocate for continuing the three (3) CSAB programs and monitor implementation and evaluation. We are confident that the Children's Trust Board will find the CSAB's Gap Analysis useful as it sets its funding priorities and that it will benefit from the CSAB's experience improving services to young children as it begins to address the needs of all of Alachua County's children.
