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Scholarship Eligibility

Poverty Guidelines

IS YOUR FAMILY/CHILD...



Below the 2024 federal poverty threshold? (At or below 200% OR between 200-400%.)

MUST PROVIDE one of the following:

- Income statements (pay stubs)
- Previous year tax return
- Letter from employer



Receiving SNAP benefits?

MUST PROVIDE: SNAP eligibility form or letter with date.

• Note: Copy of SNAP or EBT card is not accepted as verification.



On an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan?

MUST PROVIDE: A copy of IEP or 504 Plan.

• Note: Must also be at or below 400% of the 2024 federal poverty threshold.



In foster care, in voluntary formal kinship care, or under in-home case management supervision?

MUST PROVIDE: Placement letter.

*Supporting documentation for at least one selection must be provided to verify scholarship eligibility.

Freedom Schools also emphasize how scholars can make a difference in themselves, their families, schools, community, the country and world. Program features integrated reading curriculum, weekly field trips, weekly parent meetings/ workshops, enrichment activities (music, dance, sports, arts, STEM, etc.), and more.
